



Enabling PayPal

This document explains how to configure your PayPal account in order to integrate with Secure Trading.

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Enabling PayPal

Secure Trading has integrated with PayPal Express Checkout allowing you to accept PayPal transactions through the Secure Trading gateway.



Please note that PayPal do not support iframe integration.

There are a number of simple steps required to set PayPal up on your Secure Trading account:

Pre-requisites

- a. Contact your Secure Trading Account Manager to set up PayPal on your account.
- b. To add PayPal you will first need to have a PayPal Business Account. If you do not already have a PayPal Business Account, then you can open one by navigating to:

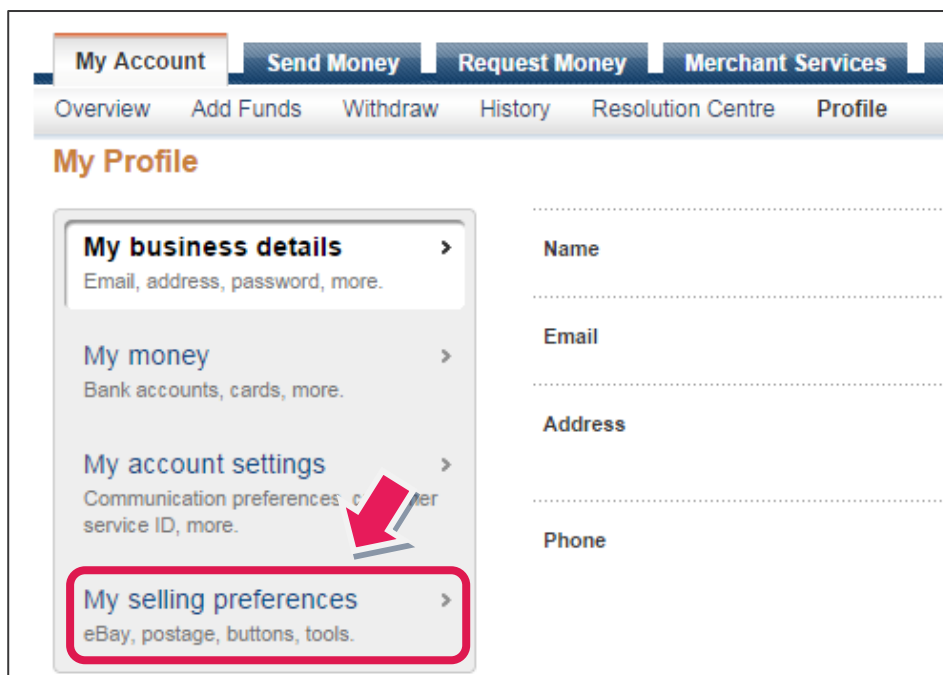

There will be no additional fees for performing PayPal transactions on your Secure Trading account. However, standard PayPal transaction fees will apply.

Step 1

Sign in to your PayPal account and navigate to “Profile”.

From the panel on the left, click “My selling preferences”.

Step 2

Under “Selling online” (this may need to be expanded) and by “API access”, click “Update”.

Step 3

Under “Option 1” click “Add or edit API permissions”.

API Access [Back to My Profile](#)

An API (Application Programming Interface) allows PayPal software to communicate with your online shop or shopping cart.

Setting up API permissions and credentials

Choose one of the following options to integrate your PayPal payment solution with your online shop or shopping cart.

Option 1 - Add or edit API permissions to view your current API settings, change your settings, or set up additional carts or online shops.

This option applies to:

- Hosted online shops and shopping carts integrated with PayPal
- Websites hosted and managed by third-party service providers

Option 2 - Request API credentials to create your own API username and password.

This option applies to:

- Custom websites and online shops
- Pre-integrated shopping carts running on your own server

Step 4

You will be presented with third parties that currently have access to your PayPal account (if any). You will need to add Secure Trading to this list by clicking “Add New Third Party”.

Enter the following into the “Third Party Permission Username” field presented on-screen:

Secure Trading should now be displayed as the "Organisation".

- Use PayPal Express Checkout to process payments.
- Issue a refund for a specific transaction.
- Process your customers' debit or credit card payments.
- Authorise and capture your PayPal transactions.
- Create and manage PayPal payment buttons on your website.
- Obtain your PayPal account balance.
- Obtain information about a single transaction.
- Search your transactions for items that match specific criteria and display the results.
- Charge an existing customer based on a prior transaction.
- Create and manage Recurring Payments.
- Obtain authorisation for pre-approved payments and initiate pre-approved transactions.
- Accept or refuse a pending transaction.
- Issue a refund for any prior transaction.
- Initiate transactions to multiple recipients in a single batch.
- Dynamically encrypt PayPal payment buttons on your web site.
- Generate consolidated reports for all accounts.
- Use PayPal Express Checkout to process mobile payments.
- Authorise transactions with Universal Air Travel Plans.
- Manage your invoicing through a third party.
- Generate reports for recurring billing and other outstanding orders.
- Capture payments in batches.
- Run dispute reports and issue batch refunds.
- Create and modify accounts, and run reports on them.
